**1. INTRODUCTION**

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the following proposals to be put forward to the Shareholders for their consideration and, if thought fit, approval:

- (a) granting to the Directors the General Mandate;
- (b) granting to the Directors the Repurchase Mandate;

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- (c) granting to the Directors the General Extension Mandate;
- (d) election of new Director; and
- (e) retirement/re-election of Directors.

### **2. GENERAL MANDATE**

It is proposed that a new General Mandate be granted to the Directors to issue further Shares. The aggregate number of Shares allotted or agreed to be allotted under the General Mandate must not exceed 20 per cent. of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the relevant resolution. There is however no present intention for any issuance of Shares pursuant to the General Mandate.

### **3. REPURCHASE MANDATE**

On 24th May, 2006, a general mandate was given to the Directors to exercise all the powers of the Company to repurchase its own Shares which will lapse at the conclusion of the forthcoming AGM. An ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM to approve the grant of a new Repurchase Mandate.

An explanatory statement to provide Shareholders with all the information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision in relation to this proposed resolution as required by the Listing Rules concerning the regulation of repurchases by companies of their own securities on the Stock Exchange is set out in the Appendix I to this circular.

### **4. GENERAL EXTENSION MANDATE**

It is recommended that the General Extension Mandate be granted to the Directors permitting them, after the grant of the Repurchase Mandate referred to above, to add to the General Mandate the number of Shares repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

The authority conferred on the Directors by the General Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the General Extension Mandate would continue in force until the earlier of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by law or the Bye-laws to be held; and (iii) its revocation or variation by ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

### **5. ELECTION OF NEW DIRECTOR**

The Board proposes to appoint Mr. Choy Wing Keung, David as an independent non-executive Director at the AGM. The particulars of Mr. Choy required to be disclosed by the Listing Rules are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

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### 6. RETIREMENT/RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

In accordance with Bye-law 99 of the Bye-laws, Mr. Leung Ying Wai, Charles, Mr. Ip Siu On and Mr. Tsui Yan Lee, Benjamin, all being executive Directors, shall retire from office at the conclusion of the AGM and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election.

Further, Mr. Tong Wui Tung, Ronald, a non-executive Director, and Mr. Ng Siu Yu, Larry, Mr. Lam Yat Cheong and Mr. Yip Chi Hung, being independent non-executive Directors, will hold office until the conclusion of the AGM. Mr. Tong and Mr. Ng have notified the Company that they will not offer themselves for re-election at the AGM for personal reasons. They have confirmed that they have no disagreement with the Board and there is no matter relating to their retirement that will need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Mr. Lam and Mr. Yip, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election.

The particulars of the aforesaid Directors to be re-elected at the AGM required to be disclosed by the Listing Rules are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

### 7. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

A notice convening the AGM for the purpose of considering and, if thought fit, passing the resolutions proposed therein together with a form of proxy for use at the AGM is contained in the 2006 annual report of the Company.

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### 10. PROCEDURE TO DEMAND A POLL AT THE AGM

At any general meeting of the Company, a poll may be demanded in respect of a resolution put to the vote at the meeting:

- (a) by the chairman of the meeting; or
- (b) by at least three Shareholders present in person or by duly authorized corporate representative or by proxy for the time being entitled to vote at the meeting; or
- (c) by any Shareholder or Shareholders present in person or by duly authorized corporate representative or by proxy and representing not less than one-tenth of the total voting rights of all Shareholders having the right to vote at the meeting; or
- (d) by any Shareholder or Shareholders present in person or by duly authorized corporate representative or by proxy and holding Shares conferring a right to vote at the meeting being Shares on which an aggregate sum has been paid up equal to not less than one-tenth of the total sum paid up on all the Shares conferring that right.

This explanatory statement contains all the information required pursuant to rule 10.06(1)(b) and other relevant provisions of the Listing Rules.

## **1. THE SHARE REPURCHASE RULES**

The Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listings are on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their fully-paid up shares on the Stock Exchange subject to certain restrictions. In this regard, the definition of “shares” in Chapter 10 of the Listing Rules would, and where used below in this explanatory statement (including the use of the word “Share(s)”) shall (unless the context otherwise requires) include shares of all classes and securities which carry a right to subscribe or purchase shares of the Company. The most important restrictions contained in the Listing Rules are summarised below: -

### **1.1. Source of funds**

Repurchases must be funded entirely from the Company’s available cash flow or working capital facilities, which will be funds legally available for the purchase in accordance with the bye-laws of the Company and the applicable laws of Hong Kong and Bermuda.

### **1.2. Exercise of the Repurchase Mandate**

Exercise in full of the Repurchase Mandate, on the basis of 301,959,607 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and on the basis that no new Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the date of the resolution approving the Repurchase Mandate, could result in up to 30,195,960 Shares (representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date) being repurchased by the Company during the course of the period from the date of resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate until the earlier of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by law or the Bye-laws to be held; and (iii) its revocation or variation by ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

### **1.3. Reasons for Repurchases**

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders to have a general authority from Shareholders to enable the Directors to repurchase Shares in the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net value of the Company and its assets and/or earnings per Share and will only be made if the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

### **1.4. Funding of Repurchases**

In repurchasing its Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose from distributable profit or funds from a new issue in accordance with its memorandum of association and Bye-laws and the laws of Bermuda.

That is to say, any repurchase of Shares may be purchased out of capital paid up on the repurchased Shares or the profits of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend and, in the case of any premium payable on such repurchase, out of profits of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or from the Company's share premium account or its contributed surplus account.

On the basis of the combined net tangible assets of the Group as at 31st December, 2006, and taking into account the current working capital position of the Group, the Directors consider that no material adverse effect on the working capital and gearing position of the Group (as compared with the position disclosed in its most recent published audited accounts as at 31st December, 2006) may result in the event that the Repurchase Mandate was to be exercised in full at any time during the proposed purchase period. The Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

### **2. GENERAL**

None of the Directors, and to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any associates of any Director, have any present intention in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders to sell any Shares to the Company.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the power of the Company to make purchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

If, as the result of a share repurchase, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of the Takeover Code. In certain circumstances, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert could as a result of increase of its or their interest, obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeover Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Poon Siu Chung directly or indirectly holds 124,831,630 Shares representing about 41.34% of the entire issued share capital of the Company. On exercise in full of Repurchase Mandate, the number of issued Shares will decrease from 301,959,607 to 271,763,647 and Mr. Poon's shareholding therein will increase to 45.93%. Therefore, as far as is known to the Directors, in the event that the Directors exercise the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, Mr. Poon will become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeover Code. However, the Board currently has no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate.

No Connected Person has notified the Company that he has a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or has undertaken not to do so, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by Shareholders.

He is an associate member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and a fellow member of the Association of Certified Chartered Accountants. He has graduated from the Hong Kong Shue Yan College with a Higher Diploma in Accountancy.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Choy had no interest in the Shares.

There is no service contract entered into between the Company and Mr. Choy. If elected at the AGM, Mr. Choy will hold office until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company and will then be eligible for re-election.

**2. MR. LEUNG YING WAI, CHARLES**

Mr. Leung, aged 57, an executive Director and the deputy Managing Director, is the co-founder of the Group. Mr. Leung joined the Group in 1978 and advises on the Group's overall corporate policies and development plans. He holds a Bachelor of Business Administration Degree from the Chinese University of Hong Kong and has over 20 years' experience in the manufacturing field.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Leung was interested in 63,097,200 Shares (representing about 20.90% of the entire issued share capital of the Company).

There is no service contract entered into between the Company and Mr. Leung. If re-elected at the AGM, Mr. Leung will not have a specific term of service with the Company but will retire and be subject to re-election at least once every three years in accordance with the Bye-laws.

**3. MR. IP SIU ON**

Mr. Ip, aged 53, an executive Director, is primarily responsible for the sales and marketing of the Group's packaging products. Before joining the Group in 1984, Mr. Ip had over 10 years' experience in the field of dye mixing and packaging products.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Ip owned 6,803,600 Shares and options carrying right to subscribe for 3,000,000 Shares.

There is no service contract entered into between the Company and Mr. Ip. If re-elected at the AGM, Mr. Ip will not have a specific term of service with the Company but will retire and be subject to re-election at least once every three years in accordance with the Bye-laws.

**4. MR. TSUI YAN LEE, BENJAMIN**

Mr. Tsui, aged 47, an executive Director, is responsible for the sales and marketing of the Group's novelties and festival decorations. Prior to joining the Group in 1983, he worked in a manufacturing company as a sales executive for over three years.

He is also an independent non-executive director of Lee's Pharmaceutical Holdings Limited and Wuyi International Pharmaceutical Company Limited, companies listed in Hong Kong.
