By the announcement of the results for the year ended 31 March 2007 of the Company dated 20 July 2007, the Directors announced that they had resolved to recommend the payment of a final dividend of HK6.8 cents per Share for the year ended 31 March 2007 to the Shareholders whose names appear on the register of members of the Company on the Record Date and also to recommend the Scrip Dividend Scheme to the Qualifying Shareholders, subject to the approval of the Shareholders on the payment of final dividend by way of the Scrip Dividend Scheme at the Annual General Meeting and the grant by the Stock Exchange of the listing of, and permission to deal in, the Scrip Shares to be allotted and issued pursuant thereto.

In arriving at the decision to recommend the Scrip Dividend Scheme to the Shareholders, the Directors consider that while the Company should declare a final dividend for the financial year ended 31 March 2007, the retention of cash, which would otherwise have been paid to the Shareholders as a cash dividend, within the Group would enhance the continuous growth, maintain the financial stability and reduce the financing costs of the Group. This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide the requisite information to enable you to make an informed decision whether to vote for or against the resolution to approve the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors.

LISTING RULES RELATING TO THE REPURCHASE OF SECURITIES

The Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listings are on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their securities on the Stock Exchange subject to certain restrictions, the most important of which is summarised below. The Company is empowered by its memorandum of association and Bye-Laws to repurchase its own securities.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 662,233,899 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution for the grant of the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no Shares are allotted and issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 66,223,389 Shares.

REASONS FOR THE REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders. An exercise of the power of the Repurchase Mandate may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share. Such an exercise will only be made if the Directors believe that a repurchase of Shares will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

In repurchasing securities, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its memorandum of association and Bye-Laws, the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

Repurchase must be funded out of funds which are legally available for the purpose and in accordance with the memorandum of association and Bye-Laws of the Company and the Companies Act. Under the Companies Act, a company may only repurchase its own securities out of capital paid up on its shares to be repurchased or out of the funds of the company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of shares made for the purpose.

Any amount of premium payable on a repurchase over the par value of the shares may only be effected out of funds of the company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the company's share premium account. Such purchase may not be made if, on the date the purchase is to be effected, there are reasonable grounds for believing that the Company is, or after the purchase would be, unable to pay its liabilities as they become due.

Taking into account the current working capital position of the Group, the Directors consider that, if the Repurchase Mandate were to be exercised in full, it might have a material adverse effect on the working capital and/or the gearing position of the Group as compared with that as at 31 March 2007, being the date of its latest published audited consolidated accounts. However, the Directors do not intend to make any repurchases to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements and/or the gearing position of the Group which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Group.

DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

None of the Directors or, to the best of their knowledge, having made all reasonable enquiries, their associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), have any present intention to sell to the Company or its subsidiaries any of the securities in the Company if the grant of the Repurchase Mandate is approved at the Annual General Meeting and exercised.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the power of the Company to make purchases of its Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the applicable laws of Bermuda and the regulations set out in the memorandum of association of the Company and the Bye-Laws.

If a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases on the Company exercising its powers to repurchase securities pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors, Mr Li Ming Hung and Mr Chen Tien Tui ("**Concert Party**"), being parties acting in concert (as defined under the Takeovers Code), were interested in approximately an aggregate of 33.06% of the then existing issued Shares and Trustcorp Limited was interested in approximately 30.19% of the then existing issued Shares. On the basis of 662,233,899 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming no further issue and repurchase of Shares prior to the date of the Annual General Meeting, if the Repurchase Mandate were exercised in full, the percentage interest of the Concert Party and Trustcorp Limited would increase to approximately 36.73% and 33.55% respectively of the then issued Shares.

On the basis of the current shareholding of the Concert Party and Trustcorp Limited, an exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full will result in the Concert Party, Trustcorp Limited and their respective concert parties becoming obliged to make a mandatory offer under the Takeovers Code.

The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that will result in any of the Concert Party, Trustcorp Limited and their respective concert parties becoming obliged to make a mandatory offer under the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, no connected person of the Company had notified the Company that he/she/it had a present intention to sell any securities of the Company nor had such connected person undertaken not to sell any of the securities held by him/her/it to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is granted.

SECURITIES REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company has not purchased any of the Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) during the six months immediately preceding the date of this circular.

Mr Lee, aged 42, is an executive Director and a director of Best Linkage (Macao Commercial Offshore) Limited, a subsidiary of the Company. He has over 21 years experience in the textile industry and is responsible for the overall management of the sales and production of the Group. Mr Lee joined the Group in 1997. Save as disclosed above, Mr Lee does not hold any other position with the Company or other members of the Group.

In the three years immediately preceding the Latest Practicable Date, Mr Lee had not held any directorship in any other listed public companies or other major appointments and qualifications.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr Lee was interested in options granted under the share option scheme of the Company to subscribe for an aggregate of 9,000,000 Shares, which represented about 1.36% of the total issued share capital of the Company pursuant to Part XV of the SFO. Apart from being a Director, Mr Lee is not related to any other directors, senior management, substantial shareholders or controlling shareholders of the Company.

Mr. Lee has not entered into any service contract with the Company or any other members of the Group and is not appointed for a specific term of directorship, but is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the provisions of the Bye-Laws. For the year ended 31 March 2007, Mr. Lee was paid an annual salary of approximately HK\$1.8 million and the use of a private car provided by the Group. Mr. Lee’s remuneration was determined with reference to his performance and contribution to the Group.

Mr Kan Ka Hon (“Mr Kan”)

Mr Kan, aged 56, is an independent non-executive Director. He graduated from The University of Hong Kong and is a qualified accountant. He is the executive director and company secretary of each of Chevalier International Holdings Limited and Chevalier Pacific Holdings Limited (formerly known as Chevalier iTech Holdings Limited) which are also companies listed on the Stock Exchange. Mr Kan has extensive experience in corporate finance, treasury and accounting and has over 27 years experience at management level in listed companies. He is also a non-executive director of Easyknit Enterprises Holdings Limited (formerly known as Asia Alliance Holdings Limited), which is a company listed on the Stock Exchange.

Save as disclosed above, Mr Kan does not hold any other position with the Company or other members of the Group.

Save as disclosed above, in the three years immediately preceding the Latest Practicable Date, Mr Kan had not held any directorship in listed public companies or other major appointments and qualifications.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr Kan did not have any interest in the shares or underlying shares in the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Apart from being an independent non-executive Director, Mr Kan is not related to any other directors, senior management, substantial shareholders or controlling shareholders of the Company.

For the year ended 31 March 2007, Mr Kan was paid an annual director's fee of HK\$150,000 as determined by the Board with regard to the expected time to be spent by Mr Kan on the affairs of the Company.

Mr Kan has not entered into any service contract with the Company or any of its subsidiaries. Mr So Kam Wah (“Mr So”)

Mr So, aged 47, is an executive Director. He is also the director and head of the manufacturing operation of 江門市新會區冠華針織廠有限公司 (Xinhui Victory City Co., Ltd.) (being its unofficial English translation), and the director of 江門豐華針織廠有限公司 (Jiangmen Feng Hua Co., Ltd.) (being its unofficial English translation) and 江門錦豐科技纖維有限公司 (Jiangmen Kam Fung Fibre Technology Co., Ltd.) (being its unofficial English translation), each being a subsidiary of the Company. He has over 24 years experience in the textile industry and is responsible for the overall manufacturing operation of the Xinhui factory. Mr So joined the Group in 1983.
