1. INTRODUCTION

2. PROPOSED GRANTING OF THE ISSUANCE MANDATE AND THE BUYBACK MANDATE

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 28 August 2012, general mandates were granted to the Directors to exercise the power of the Company to issue new Shares not exceeding 100,651,933 Shares and to repurchase Shares not exceeding 50,325,966 Shares respectively. Except for issue of 100,000,000 Shares, details of which have been disclosed in the announcement of the Company dated 25 November 2012, the said general mandates to repurchase Shares and issue new Shares have not been used since they were granted and they, to the extent not utilized by the date of the 2013 AGM, will lapse at the conclusion of the 2013 AGM.

A special general meeting is held by the Company on 30 July 2013 to approve the granting of general mandate to the Directors to allot, issue or deal with new Shares of not exceeding 20% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the relevant resolutions. Accordingly, ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the 2013 AGM to approve the granting of new general mandates to the Directors:

- (a) to allot, issue or deal with new Shares of an aggregate nominal amount not exceeding 20% of the total nominal amount of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of such resolution (i.e. an aggregate nominal amount of Shares not exceeding HK\$12,065,193.3 (equivalent to 120,651,933 Shares) on the basis that the issued ordinary share capital of the Company remains unchanged as at the date of the 2013 AGM);
- (b) to purchase Shares on the Stock Exchange of an aggregate nominal amount not exceeding 10% of the total nominal amount of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of such resolution (i.e. an aggregate nominal amount of Shares not exceeding HK\$6,032,596.6 (equivalent to 60,325,966 Shares) on the basis that the issued ordinary share capital of the Company remains unchanged as at the date of the 2013 AGM); and
- (c) to extend the Issuance Mandate by an amount representing the aggregate nominal amount of issued Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to and in accordance with the Buyback Mandate.

The Issuance Mandate and the Buyback Mandate will continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company held after the 2013 AGM or any earlier date as referred to in the proposed ordinary resolutions contained in items 11 and 12 of the notice of the 2013 AGM as set out on pages 15 to 18 of this circular. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Directors have no immediate plan to repurchase any Share or issue any new Share pursuant to the Buyback Mandate and the Issuance Mandate.

In accordance with the requirements of the Listing Rules, the Company is required to send to the Shareholders an explanatory statement containing all the information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the granting of the Buyback Mandate. 3. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF THE RETIRING DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Bye-law 86(2) of the Bye-laws, the Board shall have power from time to time and at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy on the Board or, subject to authorization by Shareholders in general meeting, as an addition to the existing Board. Any Director so appointed by the Board shall hold office only until the next following general meeting of the Company (in the case of a Director appointed to fill a casual vacancy) or the next following annual general meeting of the Company (in the case of a Director appointed as an addition to the Board) and shall then be eligible for re-election at that meeting provided that any Director who so retires shall not be taken into account in determining which particular Directors or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation at such meeting pursuant to Bye-law 87.

Pursuant to Bye-law 87 of the Bye-laws, at each annual general meeting of the Company, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three, the number nearest but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director (including Director(s) appointed for a specific term) shall be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years. The Directors to retire by rotation shall include (so far as necessary to ascertain the number of Directors to retire by rotation) any Director who wishes to retire and not to offer himself for re-election. Any further Directors so to retire shall be those of the other Directors subject to retirement by rotation who have been longest in office since their last re-election or appointment. As between persons who became or were last re-elected Directors on the same day, the person(s) to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by lot. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election by the Shareholders at the relevant annual general meeting.

According to the above Bye-laws 86(2) and 87, Mr. Jia Hong Sheng, Dr. Li Zhong Yuan, Mr. Zhou Bao Yi, Mr. Chung Ho and Mr. Zhao Hua shall retire by rotation at the 2013 AGM. Both retiring Directors, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the 2013 AGM. Pursuant to Rule 13.74 of the Listing Rules, a listed issuer shall disclose the details required under Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules of any director proposed to be re-elected or proposed new director in the notice or accompanying circular to its shareholders of the relevant general meeting, if such re-election or appointment is subject to shareholders' approval at that relevant general meeting. The requisite details of Mr. Jia Hong Sheng, Dr. Li Zhong Yuan, Mr. Zhou Bao Yi, Mr. Chung Ho and Mr. Zhao Hua are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

4. 2013 AGM AND PROXY ARRANGEMENT

The notice of the 2013 AGM is set out on pages 15 to 18 of this circular. At the 2013 AGM, resolutions will be proposed to approve, inter alia, the granting of the Issuance Mandate and the Buyback Mandate, the extension of the Issuance Mandate by the addition thereto of the nominal amount of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Buyback Mandate and the re-election of the retiring Directors.

APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE BUYBACK MANDATE

The following is an explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the 2013 AGM in relation to the granting of the Buyback Mandate.

1. REASONS FOR BUYBACK OF SHARES

The Directors believe that the granting of the Buyback Mandate is in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders. Repurchases of Shares may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share. The Directors are seeking the granting of the Buyback Mandate to give the Company the flexibility to do so if and when appropriate. The number of Shares to be repurchased on any occasion and the price and other terms upon which the same are repurchased will be decided by the Directors at the relevant time, having regard to the circumstances then pertaining.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued ordinary share capital of the Company comprised 603,259,665 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution set out in item 12 of the notice of the 2013 AGM in respect of the granting of the Buyback Mandate and on the basis that the issued ordinary share capital of the Company remains unchanged on the date of the 2013 AGM, i.e. being 603,259,665 Shares, the Directors would be authorized under the Buyback Mandate to repurchase, during the period in which the Buyback Mandate remains in force, an aggregate nominal amount of Shares up to HK\$6,032,596.6 (equivalent to 60,325,966 Shares), representing 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued ordinary Shares as at the date of the 2013 AGM.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its Memorandum of Association and Bye-laws, the laws of Bermuda and/or any other applicable laws, as the case may be.

The Company is empowered by its Memorandum of Association and the Bye-laws to repurchase Shares. The laws of Bermuda provide that the amount of capital paid in connection with a share repurchase by a company may only be paid out of the capital paid up on the relevant shares, or funds of the company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of shares made for such purpose. The amount of premium payable on a repurchase may only be paid out of the funds of the company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the share premium account of the company.

APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE BUYBACK MANDATE

4. IMPACT OF REPURCHASES

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2013) in the event that the Buyback Mandate was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Buyback Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital or the gearing levels of the Company.

5. TAKEOVERS CODE

If, on the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Buyback Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code for all the Shares not already owned by such Shareholder or group of Shareholders.

As far as the Directors are aware, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Firstsail Investments Limited, which is beneficially owned as to 50% by Chan Lee On and 50% by Shen Yuluo, held 100,000,000 Shares (representing 16.58% of the total issued Shares), Zhongxing Limited, which is wholly-owned by Ho Kin, held 76,160,474 Shares (representing 12.62% of the total issued Shares) and Dragonrise Capital Advisors Inc., which is wholly-owned by Yeung Ning, held 62,480,474 Shares (representing 10.36% of the total issued Shares). Save as disclosed above, there were no other Shareholders holding 10% or more in the issued Shares. The Directors are not aware of any consequences which will arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchase to be made under the Buyback Mandate.

6. GENERAL

None of the Directors or, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their respective associates have any present intention to sell any Share to the Company in the event that the granting of the Buyback Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Company has not been notified by any connected persons of the Company that they have a present intention to sell any Share to the Company, or that they have undertaken not to sell any Share held by them to the Company in the event that the granting of the Buyback Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the power of the Company to make repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Buyback Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

Mr. Jia has over 40 years of leadership record and development experience in strategic direction, resource origination, business and corporate management. From 1977 to 1986, he worked as the chief executive of the Computer Research Institute in Tianjin and the Party Secretary and the Director of the Tianjin Computer Industry Company. From 1986 to 1987, he served as the Deputy Secretary General and the Director of the domestic department of China Foundation for Disabled Persons. From 1987 to 1993, he was the Executive Vice President and Deputy Party Secretary and the Deputy Director of the Liquidation Committee of China Kang Hua Development Corporation. From 1993 to 2003, he served successively as the Vice President, the President and the Party Secretary of China Hua Tong Distribution & Industry Group Company. From 1986 until now, he serves as a council member of China Foundation for Disabled Persons. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Jia has not held any other directorship in listed companies in the last three years.

There is no service contract entered into between the Company and Mr. Jia yet. He does not have a fixed term of service with the Company but he will be subject to retirement and re-election in accordance with the Bye-laws. The provisions of the Bye-laws in respect of directors' retirement and re-election are set out in paragraph 3 of the Letter from the Board in this circular. The remuneration of Mr. Jia will be determined by the Board with reference to his responsibility.

As far as the Directors are aware, (1) Mr. Jia does not have any relationship with any of the other Directors, senior management, substantial Shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules), or controlling Shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company; and (2) as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Jia was not interested or deemed to be interested in any share or underlying share of the Company or its associated corporations pursuant to Part XV of the SFO.

There is no information which is discloseable nor is/was Mr. Jia involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements under paragraphs 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters concerning Mr. Jia that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

2. DR. LI ZHONG YUAN

Dr. Li Zhong Yuan, aged 51, was appointed as the executive Director on 27 November 2000. He is also a director of certain subsidiaries of the Company. Dr. Li received his PhD. in Mathematics from the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, the USA and subsequently worked as an Assistant Professor of Mathematics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, the USA ("MIT"), where he was consecutively awarded research grants from the National Science Foundation. After MIT, he held senior positions with a number of major international investment banks, including Bankers Trust Company, Salomon Brothers and IBJ Asia Limited and has extensive experience in capital raising and risk management. In late 1996, he was in charge of building up capital markets and derivative businesses in multi-asset classes in Northern Asia and was a director of Rabobank International before setting up a financial and technology investment firm. Save as disclosed above, Dr. Li has not held any other directorship in listed companies in the last three years.

Dr. Li has a service contract with the Company for a term of two years commencing from 1 September 2011 and the salary and other benefits of Dr. Li amounted to approximately HK\$2.2 million per annum for the year ended 31 March 2013, which was determined by the Board with reference to his responsibility. He is subject to retirement and re-election in accordance with the Bye-laws. The provisions of the Bye-laws in respect of directors' retirement and re-election are set out in paragraph 3 of the Letter from the Board in this circular.

As far as the Directors are aware, (1) Dr. Li does not have any relationship with any of the other Directors, senior management, substantial Shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules), or controlling Shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company; and (2) as at the Latest Practicable Date, Dr. Li had the following interests in the issued/underlying Shares pursuant to Part XV of the SFO:

- (i) He owned 13,296,000 issued Shares personally, representing approximately 2.2% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company;
- (ii) He was deemed to be interested in 11,147,000 issued Shares, representing approximately 1.85% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company, which were held by Pacific Annex Capital Limited, a company wholly owned by Dr. Li; and
- (iii) He held 2,619,000 share options granted by the Company, which entitled him to subscribe for 2,619,000 Shares, representing approximately 0.43% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company.

Save as disclosed above, Dr. Li was not interested or deemed to be interested in any Shares or underlying Shares of the Company pursuant to Part XV of the SFO.

There is no information which is discloseable nor is/was Dr. Li involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements under paragraphs 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters concerning Dr. Li that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

3. MR. ZHOU BAO YI

Mr. Zhou Bao Yi, aged 51, was appointed as the Independent Non-executive Director on 1 December 2006 and has been re-designated as the Executive Director with effect from 6 July 2007. He is the president of Vision Holding Technology Co. Ltd. Mr. Zhou received his Master degree in economics from People's University, PRC and is a certified Senior Accountant in the PRC. Mr. Zhou was the Chief Accountant, president and chairman in Northeastern Electric Transmission And Transformation Equipment Group Ltd. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Zhou has not held any other directorship in listed companies in the last three years.

There is no service contract entered into between Mr. Zhou and the Company, but the salary and other benefits of Mr. Zhou amounted to approximately HK\$0.5 million per annum for the year ended 31 March 2013, which was determined by the Board with reference to his responsibility.
