INTRODUCTION

At the forthcoming AGM, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to seek the Shareholders' approval for, among other things, (i) the granting of the General Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors; and (ii) the re-election of Directors. The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information relating to the above resolutions and the notice of the AGM.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

GENERAL MANDATE AND REPURCHASE MANDATE

At the AGM, the Directors propose to seek the approval of the Shareholders to grant to the Directors the General Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate.

General Mandate

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed such that the Directors be given an unconditional general mandate (i.e. the General Mandate) to allot, issue and deal with unissued Shares or underlying shares of the Company (other than by way of rights or pursuant to a share option scheme for employees of the Company or Directors and/or any of its subsidiaries (if applicable) or pursuant to any scrip dividend scheme or similar arrangements providing for the allotment and issue of Shares in lieu of whole or part of the dividend on Shares in accordance with the Bye-laws) or make or grant offers, agreements, options and warrants which might require the exercise of such power, of an aggregate nominal amount of up to 20% of the issued Shares as at the date of granting the General Mandate.

In addition, a separate ordinary resolution will further be proposed for extending the General Mandate authorising the Directors to allot, issue and deal with Shares to the extent of the Shares repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate. Details on the Repurchase Mandate are further elaborated below.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had an aggregate of 776,720,096 Shares in issue. Subject to the passing of the resolution for the approval of the General Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of AGM, the Company would be allowed under the General Mandate to allot, issue and deal with a maximum of 155,344,019 Shares, representing 20% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution.

On 8 April 2013, the Company entered into a subscription agreement with a subscriber (the “**Subscription Agreement**”) which is a company beneficially owned by Mr. Cheng Keung Fai, a substantial shareholder (as defined under the Listing Rules) of the Company in relation to the subscription of the convertible bonds with the aggregate principal amount of HK\$314,640,110 to be issued by the Company (the “**Convertible Bonds**”). Pursuant to the subscription agreement and upon full conversion of the Convertible Bonds at the initial conversion price thereunder, the Convertible Bonds will be converted into a maximum of 731,721,186 Shares. Assuming full conversion of Convertible Bonds and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of AGM, the Company will have an aggregate of 1,508,441,282 Shares in issue. On this basis, subject to the passing of the resolution for the approval of the General Mandate, the Company would be allowed under the General Mandate to allot, issue and deal with a maximum of 301,688,256 Shares, representing 20% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution.

The Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plan to issue any new Shares other than Shares which may fall to be issued upon the conversion of the Convertible Bonds, or any scrip dividend which may be approved by the Shareholders.

Repurchase Mandate

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will also be proposed such that the Directors be given an unconditional general mandate to repurchase Shares (i.e. the Repurchase Mandate) on the Stock Exchange of an aggregate amount of up to 10% of the issued Shares as at the date of granting of the Repurchase Mandate.

Subject to the passing of the resolution for the approval of the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 77,672,009 Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution.

Pursuant to the Subscription Agreement, assuming full conversion of the Convertible Bonds at the initial conversion price, the Convertible Bonds will be convertible into a maximum of 731,721,186 Shares. Assuming full conversion of Convertible Bonds and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of AGM, the Company will have an aggregate of 1,508,441,282 Shares in issue. On this basis, subject to the passing of the resolution for the approval of the Repurchase Mandate, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase with a maximum of 150,844,128 Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution.

The General Mandate (including the extended General Mandate) and the Repurchase Mandate shall continue to be in force during the period from the date of passing of the resolutions for the approval of the General Mandate (including the extended General Mandate) and the Repurchase Mandate up to (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Bye-laws, the Companies Act 1981 of Bermuda (as amended) or any applicable laws of Bermuda to be held; or (iii) the revocation or variation of the General Mandate (including the extended General Mandate) or the Repurchase Mandate (as the case may be) by ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting, whichever occurs first.

An explanatory statement in connection with the Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix I to this circular. The explanatory statement contains all requisite information required under the Listing Rules to be given to the Shareholders to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolution approving the Repurchase Mandate.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

According to Bye-laws 87(1) and 87(2), at each annual general meeting one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to but not greater than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director (including those appointed for a specified term or holding office as chairman, managing director or other office) shall be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

In accordance with Bye-laws 87(1) and 87(2), Ms. Law Kee, Alice and Mr. Tang Ping Sum shall retire from office by rotation at the AGM. Being eligible, each of Ms. Law Kee, Alice and Mr. Tang Ping Sum will offer herself/himself for re-election as executive Director/independent non-executive Director (as the case maybe).

At the AGM, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to re-elect each of Ms. Law Kee, Alice and Mr. Tang Ping Sum as executive Director/independent non-executive Director (as the case may be).

Particulars relating to each of Ms. Law Kee, Alice and Mr. Tang Ping Sum are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

VOTING AT THE AGM

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, all votes of the Shareholders at the AGM must be taken by poll and the Company will announce the results of the poll in the manner prescribed under Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide requisite information to you for your consideration of the Repurchase Mandate.

1. REPURCHASE OF SECURITIES FROM CONNECTED PARTIES

The Listing Rules prohibit the Company from knowingly purchasing its securities on the Stock Exchange from a “connected person”, that is, a director, chief executive or substantial shareholder of the Company or any of its subsidiaries or their respective associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) and a connected person is prohibited from knowingly selling to the Company his/her/its securities of the Company.

No connected person of the Company has notified the Company that he/she/it has a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company nor has any such connected person undertaken not to sell any of the Shares held by him/her/it to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is passed.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 776,720,096 fully paid Shares.

Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution for the approval of the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 77,672,009 fully paid Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution.

Pursuant to the Subscription Agreement, assuming full conversion of the Convertible Bonds at the initial conversion price, the Convertible Bonds will be convertible into a maximum of 731,721,186 Shares. Assuming full conversion of Convertible Bonds and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of AGM, the Company will have an aggregate of 1,508,441,282 Shares in issue. On this basis, subject to the passing of the resolution for the approval of the Repurchase Mandate, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase with a maximum of 150,844,128 Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution.

3. REASONS FOR THE REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. An exercise of the Repurchase Mandate may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases would be funded entirely from the Company’s available cash flow or working capital facilities which will be funded legally available under the Bermuda law and the memorandum of association and the bye-laws of the Company and for such purpose.

An exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full may have a material adverse impact on the working capital and gearing position of the Company compared with those as at 31 December 2012, being the date of its latest published audited consolidated accounts. The Directors do not, however, intend to make any repurchase in circumstances that would have a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company.

6. DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS AND MINIMUM PUBLIC HOLDING

None of the Directors or, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, their associates, have any present intention to sell to the Company or its subsidiaries any of the Shares in the Company if the Repurchase Mandate is approved at the AGM.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and applicable laws of Bermuda.

If a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases on the Company exercising its powers to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date and based on the register kept by the Company under section 336 of the SFO, the following Shareholder held 5% or more of the Company's issued share capital:

Note: The 731,721,186 Shares held by Full Dragon Group Limited represent 731,721,186 Shares to be allotted and issued upon the exercise of the conversion rights attaching to the Convertible Bonds in an aggregate principal amount of not more than HK\$314,640,110 with an initial conversion price of HK\$0.43 per conversion share of the Company. Mr. Cheng, the beneficial owner of the entire issued share capital of Full Dragon Group Limited, is deemed to be interested in the 731,721,186 Shares held by Full Dragon Group Limited under the SFO.

If the Company repurchases the maximum amount of Shares that it would be authorised to under the Repurchase Mandate (if it is approved by the Shareholders at the AGM), the percentage voting rights controlled by Mr. Cheng Keung Fai in the Company would increase to (i) assuming that the conversion rights attaching to the convertible bonds held by Full Dragon Group Limited is not exercised, approximately 61.67% and (ii) assuming that the convertible bonds held by Full Dragon Group Limited are converted into Shares, approximately 85.66%. The Directors are not aware of any Shareholder or Group of Shareholders acting in consent who will become obliged to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code as a result of repurchase of the Shares.

The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that will result in a requirement of any of the above Shareholders, or any other persons to make a general offer under the Takeovers Code or the number of Shares in the hands of public falling below the prescribed minimum percentage of 25%.

7. SHARES REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company had not purchased any of its Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) during the previous six months immediately prior to the date of the Latest Practicable Date.

Detail of the Directors who will retire from office at the AGM and being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the AGM, are set out below:

(1) MS. LAW KEE, ALICE (“MS. LAW”)

Ms. Law, aged 46, is an executive Director and the Chief Executive Officer of the Company. Ms. Law holds a bachelor degree in business administration from University of Management and Technology, USA. She has extensive experience in business development, operation and marketing management. She is a member of The Hong Kong Institute of Directors and a member of The Hong Kong Real Property Federation.

Ms. Law has entered into a service contract with the Company for an initial term of one year commencing from 16 October 2007 and shall continue thereafter until terminated by either party giving to the other not less than three months’ prior written notice. She is subject to retirement by rotation and/or re-election at general meetings in accordance with the Bye-laws. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Law was entitled to a monthly remuneration of HK\$85,000, with a fixed year-end bonus of HK\$85,000 pursuant to the service contract, performance-based discretionary bonus and a provident fund of 7.5% of her annual remuneration for the benefit of her mandatory provident fund account.

Ms. Law does not have, and is not deemed to have, any interests in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO and does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial Shareholders or controlling shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

(2) MR. TANG PING SUM (“MR. TANG”)

Mr. Tang, aged 56, was appointed as an independent non-executive Director on 1 November 2010. Mr. Tang obtained a bachelor degree of commerce from University of Western Australia in December 1981 and a master degree of applied finance from Macquarie University, Australia in April 1992. He is a certified practicing accountant of Australia and was a fellow member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants until 2007. Mr. Tang has over 13 years’ experiences in the securities industry in Hong Kong.

Mr. Tang joined Hantec Investment Holdings Limited (stock code: 111, now known as Cinda International Holdings Limited), a company listed on the Stock Exchange, in January 1998. He was appointed as its executive director in May 2000 until October 2006. He was then the head of China division of Taifook Securities Group from January 2007 to September 2008, responsible for developing its securities businesses in China. Mr. Tang is currently the responsible officer and executive director of Grand Partners Asset Management Limited (“**Grand Partners**”) and is mainly responsible for monitoring the risk control of Grand Partners.

From March 2003 to December 2006, Mr. Tang was an independent non-executive director of Cosmopolitan International Holdings Limited (stock code: 120), a company listed on the Stock Exchange. He was an independent non-executive director of Sino Resources Group Limited (stock code: 223), a company listed on the Stock Exchange, from 30 April 2009 to 31 December 2010; and a non-executive director of Univision Engineering Limited (AIM code: UVEL), a company listed on the Alternative Investment Market of the London Stock Exchange, from December 2005 to December 2011. He is currently an independent non-executive director of China Investment Development Limited (Stock code: 204), a company listed on the

Stock Exchange, since 6 April 2011. Save for being a Director and as disclosed, he did not hold any directorship in the last three years in any public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas nor within the Group.

Mr. Tang does not have, and is not deemed to have, any interests in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO and does not have any relationships with any Directors, senior management, substantial Shareholders or controlling Shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company. Pursuant to his appointment letter, Mr. Tang is appointed for an initial term of one year commencing from 1 November 2010 to 31 October 2011 (both dates inclusive), which term is renewable for successive term of one year. Either Mr. Tang or the Company may terminate such appointment by giving at least one month's notice in writing to the other. Mr. Tang shall be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Bye-laws. He is entitled to director's emoluments of HK\$8,000 per month which is determined by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibilities in the Company.

There is no information relating to Ms. Law and Mr. Tang that is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rules 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules.

Save as disclosed herein, there is no other matter relating to Ms. Law and Mr. Tang that needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.
